1. CALL TO ORDER

2. TOPIC FOR BOARD DISCUSSION

a. Special Education Programs

Executive Director Beauchaine introduced Sue Ellen Nichols, Futures Program teacher. This program serves students 18-21 years who have completed academic requirements at Steilacoom High, but have not yet met all their IEP goals. The

student interns work primarily outside the district in partnerships in the community. They also operate Front Desk, a multi-service copy center located in-district. Three of the students were in attendance and presented to the Board. Will talked about working at Saltar's Point Elementary Library and the NW Washington Fair booth. Soleil and Sammie both shared their work at the Lakewood Town Center Old Navy store, 3 days a week. The interns use Pierce County Transit to travel between the district and the store. One of the biggest compliments the Futures Program has received came from Old Navy, who recognized that due to the work of the of the Futures Team organizing merchandise, they have seen an increase in sales. The Futures Program works with other local organizations and is always looking for more opportunities for the interns to work on-site.

Principal Fernandes described the middle school independent living skills activities offered to students. Principal Miller described the FSA program at Steilacoom High and the use of Front Desk.

b. Health Education - secondary schools

Executive Director Harvey gave an overview of current district health curriculum for all grades. The district health and PE teachers are exemplary and involved in national Society of Health and Physical Educators (SHAPE) and grant funded resources. Secondary Principals Fernandes and Miller then discussed specific issues and needs of their schools. Discussion of potential resources and solutions followed.

c. Board Self-Assessment Tool

Board reviewed and discussed report from WSSDA Board Assessment results.

d. Progress Report

Superintendent Weight updated the Board on other districts in our league researching the sleep study and start times. Many looking into the research and feedback; none are adopting any changes at this time.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

First Reading Policy 2030 Service Animals in Schools

WSSDA has revised this policy to reflect Substitute House Bill 2822 (2018) – Service Animal Misrepresentation. The legislation revised the state's definition of a service animal to align with the federal definition under Title II and Title II of the American with Disabilities Act. Additionally the law added a penalty for the intentional misrepresentation of a service animal.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is the recommendation of the Superintendent to move this policy to second reading.

SERVICE ANIMALS IN SCHOOLS

The Steilacoom School District No.1 Board of Directors acknowledges its responsibility to permit students and/or adults with disabilities to be accompanied by a "service animal" as required by federal laws and Washington State's law against discrimination. This policy governs the presence of service animals in the schools, on school property, including school buses and at school activities.

A "service animal" means an animal, any dog or miniature horse that is individually trained for the purpose of assisting or accommodating a disabled person's sensory, mental or physical disability to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual, or other mental disability. The work or tasks performed by the service animal must be directly related to the individual's disability.

The crime deterrent effects of an animal's presence and the provision of emotional support, wellbeing, comfort, or companionship do not constitute work or tasks.

It is a civil infraction to misrepresent an animal as a service animal. A student's The parent/guardian of a student who believes their the student needs to bring a service animal to school or an employee who wishes to bring a service animal to school, must submit a written request to the building principal. The building principal, in consultation with the Section 504 coordinator or director of special services, as appropriate, will determine whether or not to permit the service animal in school.

The superintendent will develop procedures to implement the policy.
